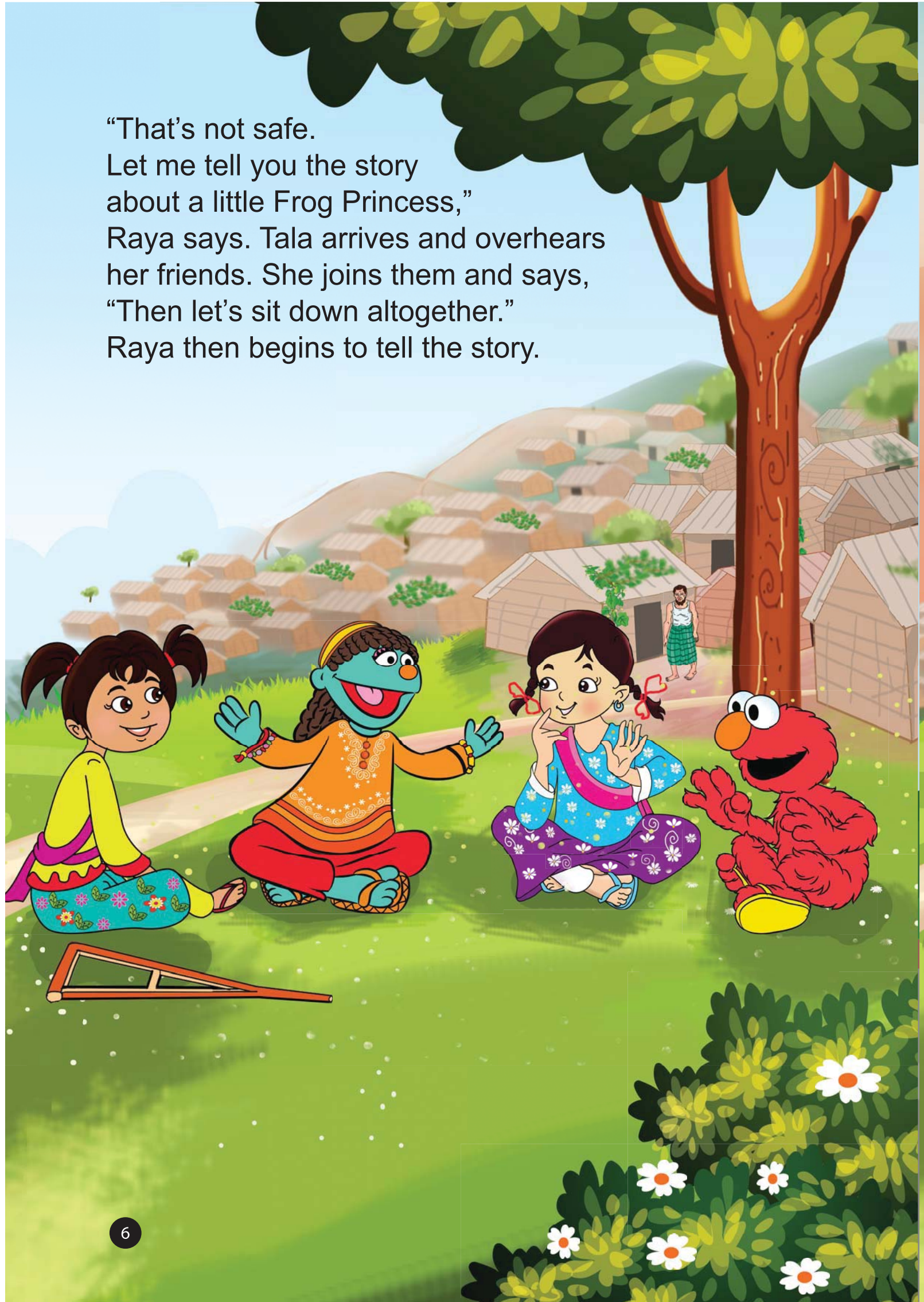

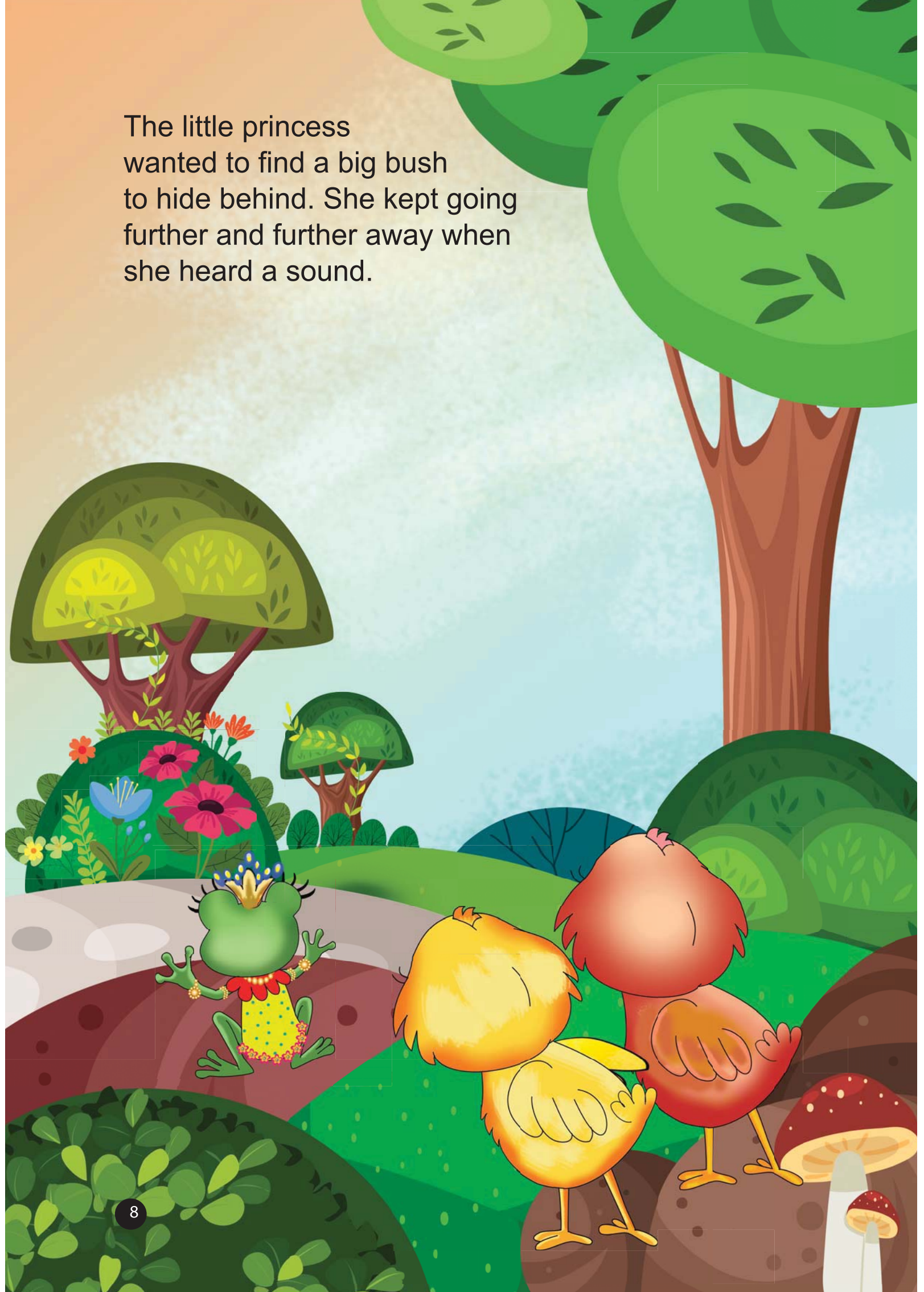
“That’s not safe.

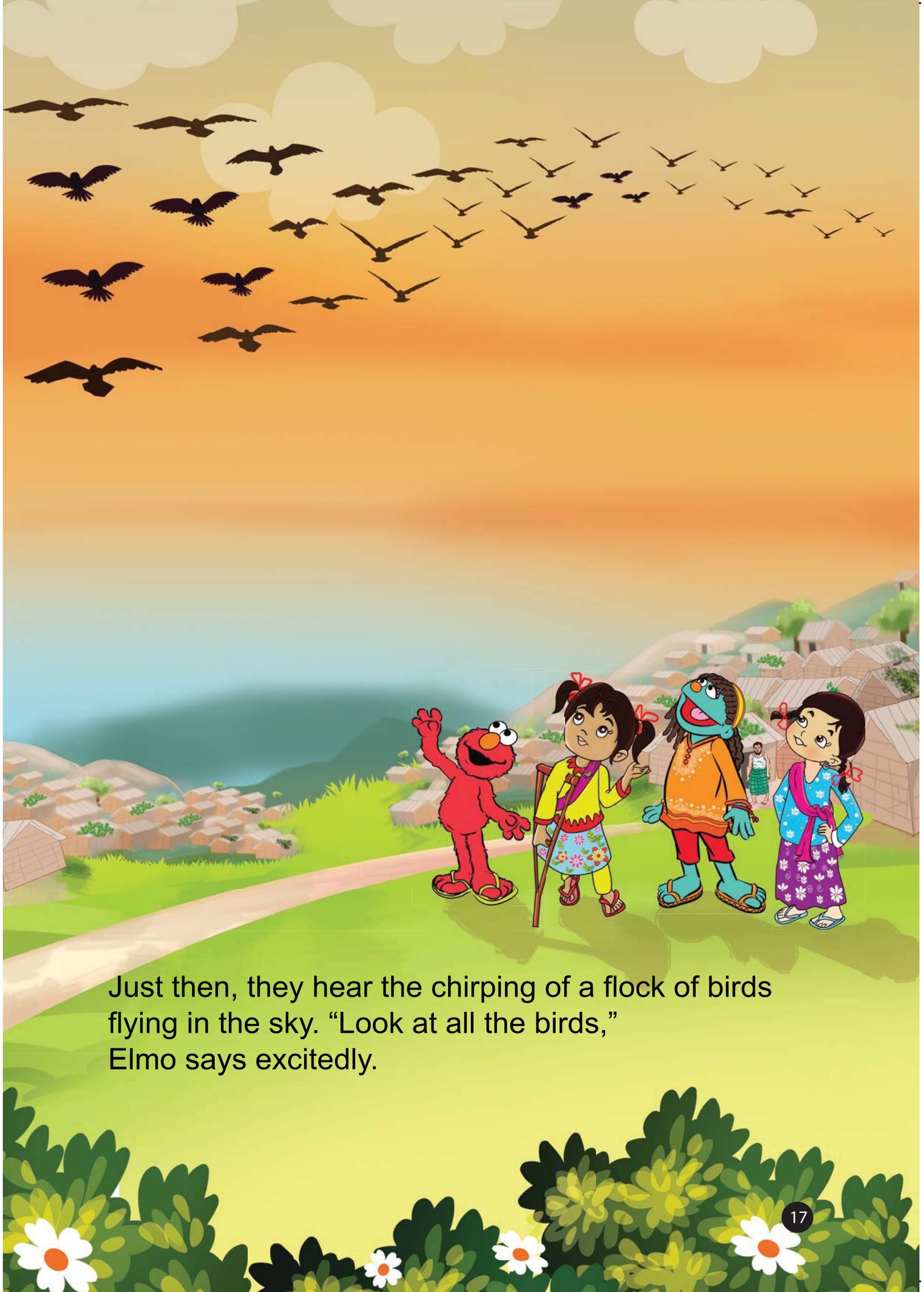
