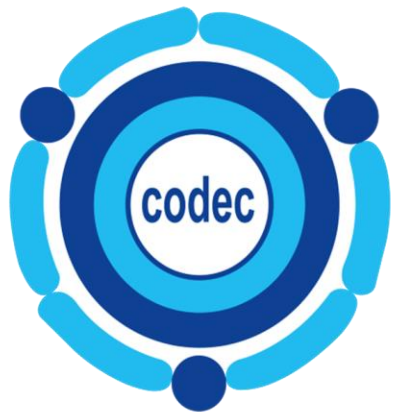

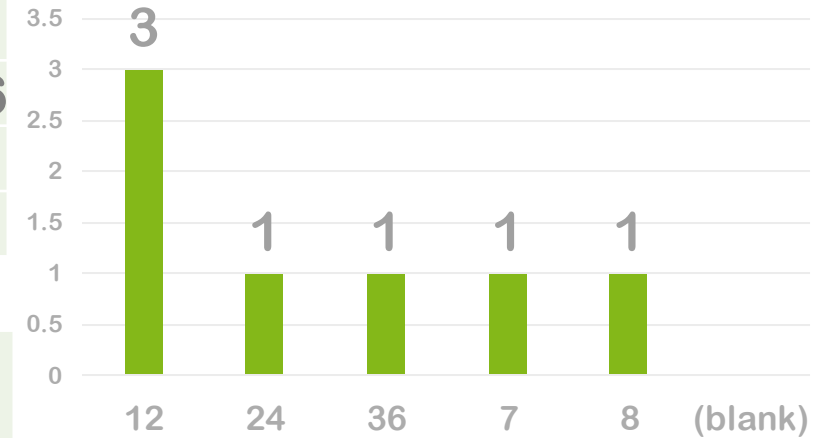

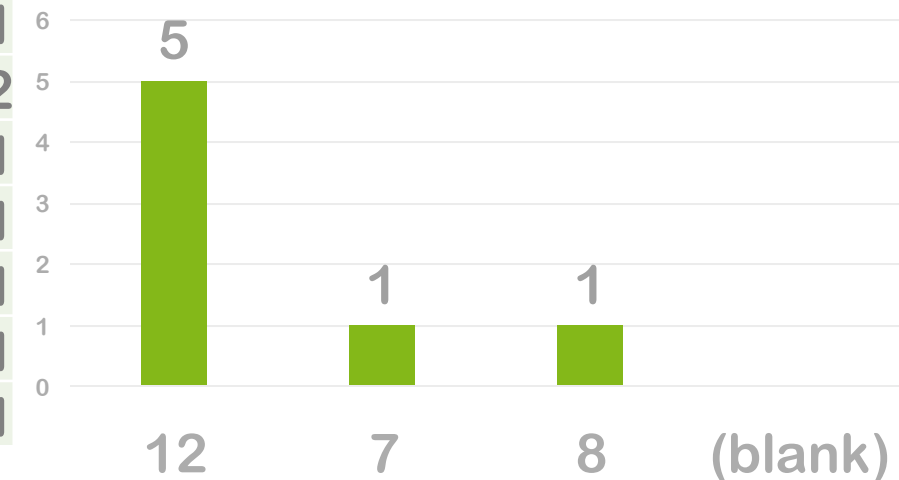

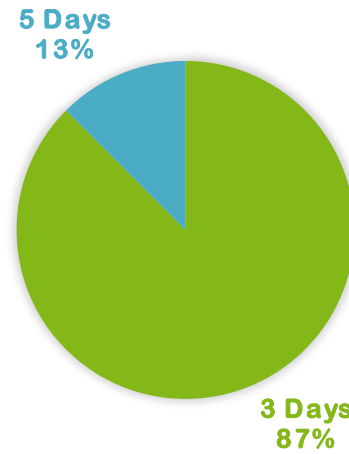


How many titles of the Flipcharts

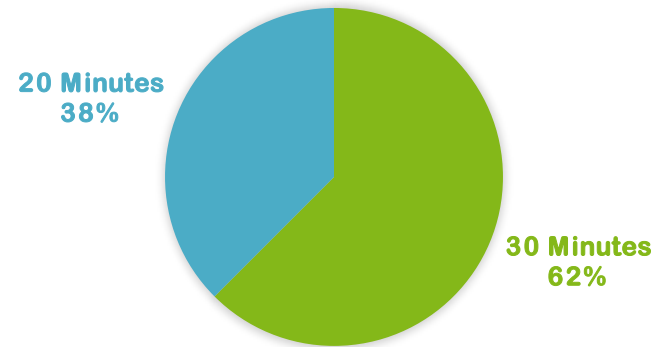

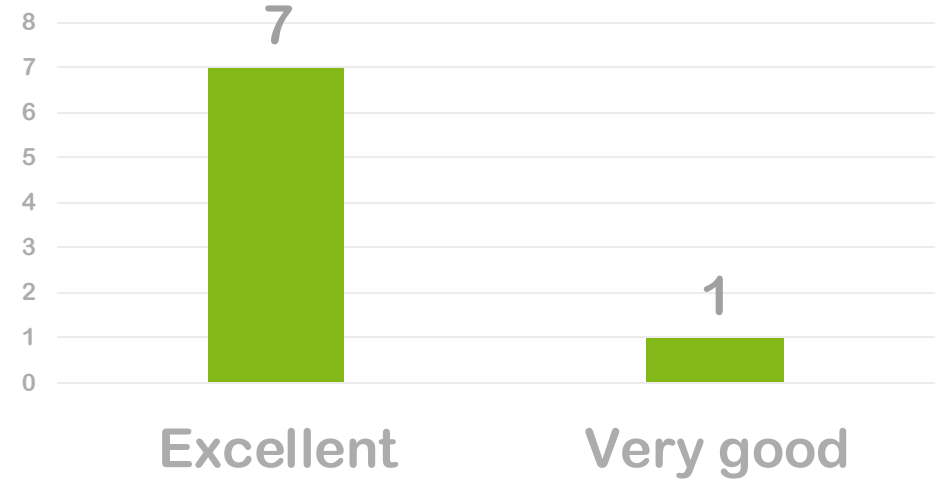

- Play and game, etc.

- Use of Props, puppets, decoration items

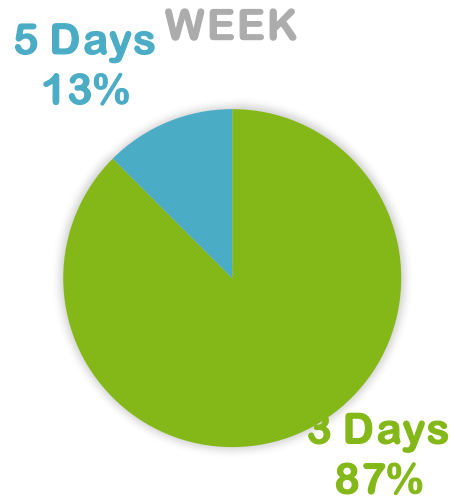

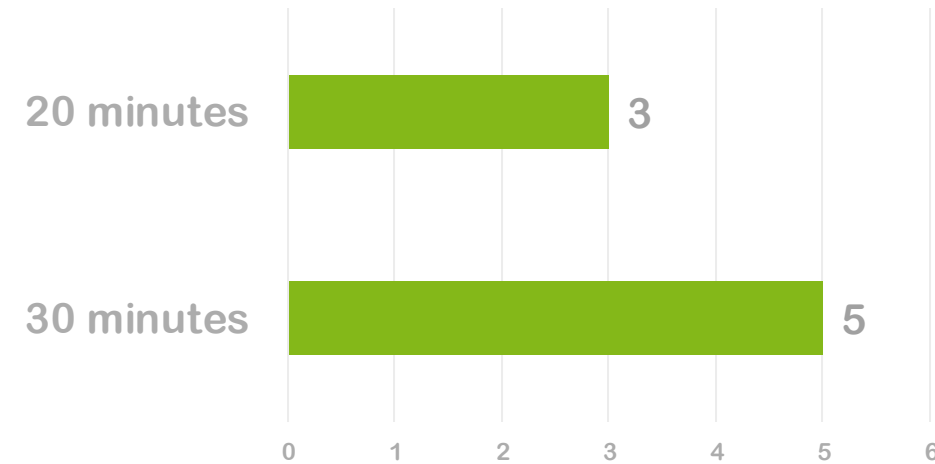
Response from the Children

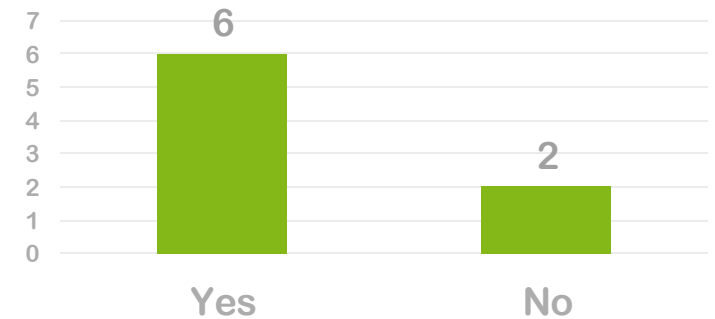
