Just as a flower grows in a garden,

Listening

to children, and responding to what they say, encourages them to keep learning (and growing!).

Storytelling

sparks children's imaginations and teaches them to solve problems.

Singing

helps children learn and remember new words—plus sharing music is a great way to bond!

Talking

helps little ones build their vocabulary, like pointing out the names of different foods on their plate.

Asking

children questions like "what if?" or "what do you think?" helps them express themselves and make choices.
